

## Home Disaster Kit

Storage (best if waterproof/  
rainproof)

- Garbage can with wheels
- Plastic crates with solid lids
- Duffle bags

Water, Food, Sanitation (recommend  
7-10 days)

- Drinking water (1  
gallon/person/day)
- Easy to prepare food (minimal  
cooking) with long shelf life.
- While this can include food in  
your kitchen, you will want  
some in your kit in case you  
need to relocate quickly
- Manual can opener
- Paper or plastic plates, eating  
utensils
- 5 gallon plastic bucket
- Box of medium sized plastic  
garbage bags (kitchen can  
sized) for lining toilet or  
bucket
- Toilet paper
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Personal/feminine hygiene  
products
- Towels
- Soap
- Baby or wet wipes
- Hand sanitizer
- Household bleach and  
dropper
- Infaperson
- Tent, tarp, or plastic sheeting
- Nylon cord or twine, 50'

Equipment and Tools

- Paper and pencil
- Whistle
- Flashlights or lanterns with  
extra batteries (recommend  
LED style lights)
- Phone charger system  
(battery or solar)
- Portable battery powered  
radio for news

Medical Supplies (continued)

Sunscreen

First Aid In addition to a  
standard first aid kit add the  
following trauma supplies:

- o Sterile 4x4 gauze (1  
stack/person)
- o Roller gauze (2/person)
- o Triangular bandages  
(2/person)
- o Fabric medical tape (2 rolls) u(o)T
